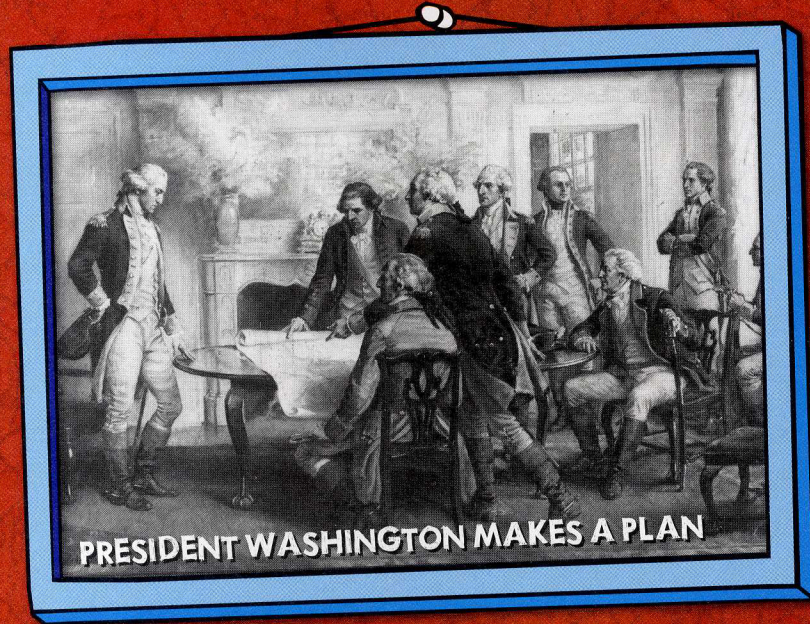
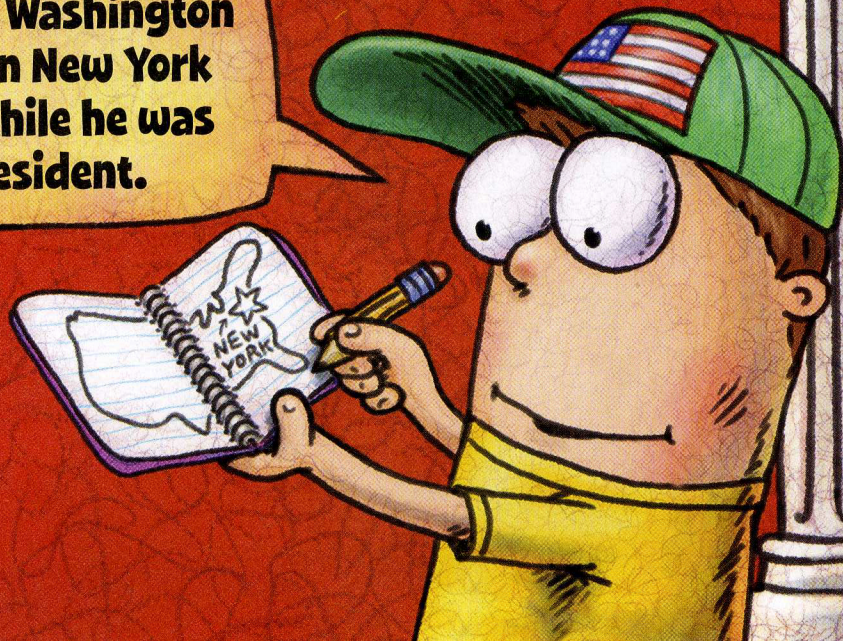


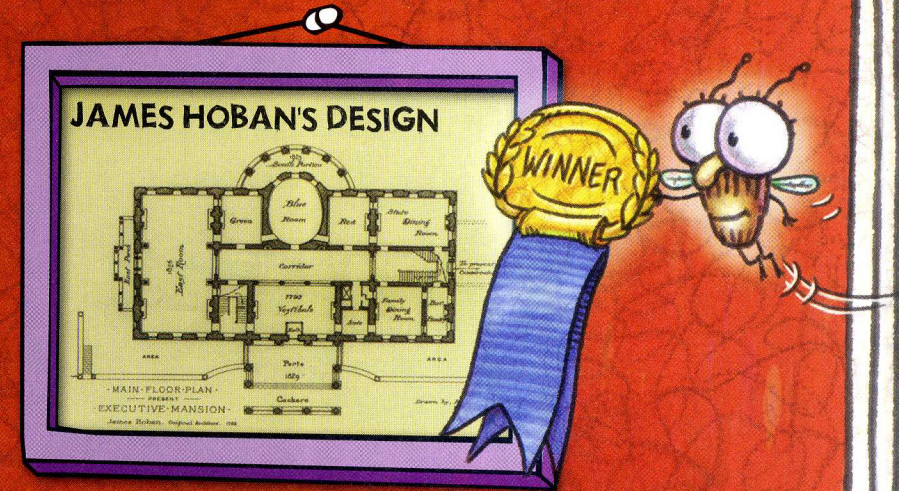
President Washington chose the location of the country's new capital city. It was named in his honor.



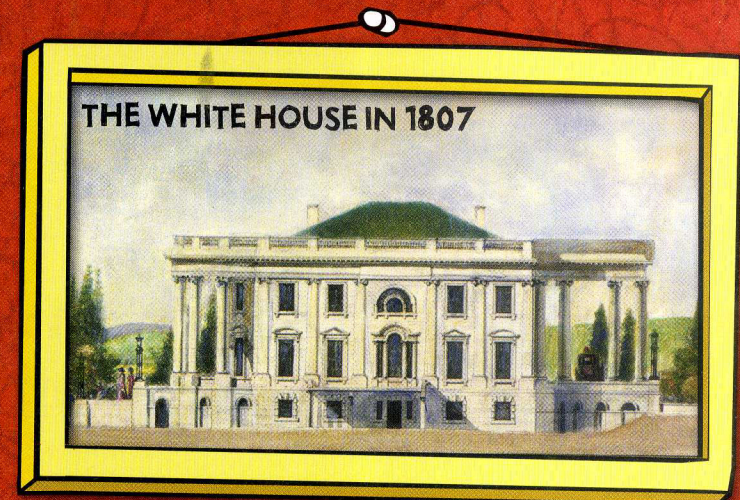
George Washington lived in New York City while he was president.
